At this February meeting we were quoted roughly a 13 month timeline for the construction of the new pavilion. If that holds true (which I bet it will not...) that would bring the finish date in March of 2016. Construction to start in October this year.

Meadowcreek Village is fortunate enough to have a weather station located within the neighborhood on the Forest Oaks bridge. With all the recent rain I thought it would be interesting to compare it to a our biggest rainfall event, Tropical Storm Allison! TS Allison dumped 21 inches of water in 5 days! About 12.5 inches were dropped in a 24 hour period. The

recent torrential rain from the evening of May 25th to morning of May 26th was 6.68 inches (a 12 hour period). Although the water level in Berry Creek got high it was not anywhere near its capacity. There was some street flooding. It has been known that during TS Allison the water never came over the banks. So, as it stands, Berry Creek has yet to see it's limits: knock on wood!

Mauricio Torres states: "The most common issue people have with their pet is separation anxiety. Here are some tips to avoid crying, barking, chewing and total destruction of your house!'

The most effective method is a good walk before work. This may be difficult for some because of our busy schedule but a good walk goes a long way. It burns off energy and distracts the mind.

You could then reward your pet using treats, their food (entire meal or a few kibbles); a Kong stuffed with treats or peanut butter (try freezing peanut butter in a Kong to keep them busy. (Kong toys can be found at your local pet stores). However, remember to reward them after they have gone into their designated area to get into a routine.

Most anxiety is triggered by the tone of your voice. Upon departure, separation anxiety could go from bad to worse due to the fact that we excite our dogs by saying, "I'll be back, you be a good boy," usually in a high pitch voice. The best thing you can do is to just walk out the door as if your 4legged friend wasn't there.

Remember, a walk is very important for a well behaved dog. Oftentimes, your dog may just be bored. It is always important to keep him busy. 

June /July 2015

Kayaking Berry Creek to Glenbrook Park - Jose Rocha

Meadowcreek Village residents **Jose Rocha** and **Aaron Lopez** went on a 3 hour kayak tour from Berry Creek (back yard of the Rocha residence) to Sims Bayou and around the oxbow and then out into Glenbrook park. See map for route.

"We did a lot of sight seeing! It was very exciting tour that kept us on the edge of our kayaks as we slowly tried to anticipate what obstacle was to come at us at the turn of every bend!

The Berry Creek section stretch was interesting: a couple of snakes, a bunch of ducks and fish. One fish was upsidedown, when I approached, the fish flipped and swam off! It gave me the look of being bothered, how odd, I thought.

Hitting the bayou island (island was created when the Sims Bayou Channel was made), it was a bit surreal to see it from the water. I've curiously driven through the street side just to check it, but seeing it from the waterside was cool: lots of old battered docks; there is an old Buick automobile in the water; we saw a large tree growing out of a tire; saw Ed Meek's dock. There are very shallow areas around there. This stretch only passable by kayak or canoe as there are also downed trees. (Silt build-up has been a problem since new channel was created.)

Arriving at Sims Bayou I think was the best! You felt the breeze and it opened up very nicely! Great view there!

The oxbow, was good to see, it is obvious that it is stagnant or it flows, at a very slow rate. But I guess this is what makes an oxbow! It was cool to see the nice docks that still have survived: the remnants of what appeared to be the aquaculture farm that I've heard about. The nicest was from the Nature Center.

Back on Sims..just felt great! To be going under the pedestrian bridges made you feel so small.

Getting out was easy; not so easy was carrying (or dragging) the kayaks all the way back to the parking lot.

I would do it again! If anyone is interested, I'd be happy to join you and we can use my back yard to launch."
