Hello Meadowcreek residents.

This coming year, 2016, there will be some changes to the Meadowcreek Village newsletter distribution and printing. For those of you who do not know, the newsletter was started some 25+ years ago by one of the realtors, who printed the letter pro-bono. Up until about 4 or 5 years ago, the newsletter was distributed by block/area captains to the residents' homes. After some time, the civic club became responsible for the printing, obtaining paid advertising from local businesses, and distribution of this newsletter. Two or three years ago the civic club board, and then, editor elected to cut back the printings to 5 times per year, which left one printing for the membership letter.

Times have changed: news information is now obtained through the internet. Meadowcreek Village has a Facebook page; and for those who are not on Facebook, Meadowcreek Village is in Nexdoor.com. Also due to the aging population and busy households with two income earners and the ever busy lifestyles of many people, distribution of the newsletter is now handled by the US Mail.

Printing and distributing this newsletter to 1400+ households, costs money. The approximate cost per newsletter printing, labeling and mailing is \$600 to \$700. The civic club board reviewed the income of membership fees versus the expenses of the newsletter. The decision was made to limit the mass mailing of the newsletter to one time per year. This mass mailing will take place after the holiday season of each year (Jan/Feb). The remainder of the newsletters will be printed for members only for those members who request a hard copy or members who do not have email; the newsletter will be emailed for those who have email addresses. The editor will also upload the newsletter to the Facebook file folder. By limiting the mass mailing to one time per year the club will save approximately \$2500 to \$2800.


